
#### **The Peace Jesus Brings**

Matthew 10:34 "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword."

Christmas is a time to celebrate the coming of Jesus. God the Son took on flesh and dwelt among us. What an amazing thing it is to know that God humbled himself and came as a baby in a manger! God did not leave it for people to guess what had happened. He sent angels to proclaim this great news to Mary, Joseph, and even to humble shepherds.

The child was "Christ the Lord" and the angels praised God saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" (Luke 2 ESV)

We know that Jesus came, but do we remember why Jesus came?



You may think, "Wait, I thought Jesus came to bring peace! Isn't that what the angels sang in Luke chapter 2?" Well, you are right. Jesus did bring peace. Through his death on the cross for our sins. By faith, we, who are enemies of God, can have peace with God. Our relationship with God is reconciled! In this way, Jesus brings peace. But the sad truth is that peace with God has brought division as well.

The first week of October, a few members of our mission team went with me to visit a missionary couple who minister to the Afghan immigrant population in Detroit. These immigrants are almost exclusively Muslims and ministry can be difficult. One resource these missionaries shared with us is the book *Seeking Allah*, *Finding Jesus* by Nabeel Quresh. This month, I found the time to read it.

Nabeel grew up as a Muslim but put his faith in Jesus after being confronted with the truth of Christianity and the love of a Christian friend. Nabeel experienced both the peace and the sword of Jesus. Nabeel writes in his chapter *The Cost of Embracing the Cross*, "The cost for a Muslim to accept the gospel can be tremendous. Of course, following Jesus meant that I would immediately be ostracized from my community. For all devout Muslims, it means sacrificing the friendships and social connections that they have built from childhood. It could mean being rejected by one's parents, siblings, spouse, and children." (p.251)

Islam is divided into factions, Sunnis and Shias, but all four major schools of Sunni thought and all three major schools of Shia thought teach that people who leave Islam must be killed for their apostasy, disagreeing only on the details of qualifying circumstances and implementation. (p.61)

Nabeel is describing the "sword" that Jesus brings. Receiving Jesus, for many in the world, can mean rejection from those they love. I am thankful that I did not have to make that sacrifice when I became a Christian. I can't say what I would have done if I were in Nabeel's place. Muslims, Hindus, Mormons, and many others understand the dangerous truth of Jesus' coming. Truth divides and we should be sympathetic to those who struggle with the cost of following Jesus. And may we count the cost and follow Jesus. (Luke 14:28)

#### Our new historical wall -

This newly decorated wall is on the west side of the annex by the pastor's office. In the past year during closet cleaning and painting of the sanctuary and annex, these pictures were RE-discovered. The one on the left is from the year 1900 at the turn of the century in which all present on this first Sunday of that year placed their signature on paper which then hung in the church. With a desire to duplicate this event in 2000, a photo was taken along with signatures of all those present on the first Sunday of this current century, hanging on the right.

The middle document is of the Articles of Incorporation signed in 1891. Both this document and the older signature page were very faded and in need of some work.

They were all three taken to be framed and placed in museum quality glass in order to better preserve them. Next was naming the wall with banner and title "Two Centuries of Praising and Serving our Lord".

We should all be so proud of this historical showing of our many years of being so blessed!





