### Thoughts from Ian...



#### July 2023 Newsletter

Last week, I attended the annual General Assembly of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church. This meeting of our denomination is an important time to worship together, learn together, and accomplish the work of the EPC at large.

Yesterday during worship, I gave a Biblical explanation of why this time was important. For example, in 1 Corinthians 12, the Apostle Paul describes the church as the global body of Christ consisting of all those who have received the Holy Spirit. We need one another, not just locally, but globally, to accomplish God's work. There is a strong Biblical case to embrace the connectional-ism the EPC makes possible.

Outside of the theological case, there is also a practical case for being a part of a denomination like the Evangelical Presbyterian Church. Let me give a few practical reasons:

To Ensure Pastors Are Called By God And Meet Biblical Standards: Pastors can be a source of great harm or great blessing to a local church and its people. This is the reason we find in Scripture high qualifications for someone to hold such a leadership position. Because of this, there should be a rigorous, time-tested, Biblically-faithful process by which people are ordained as pastors. Denominations provide a process to confirm someone's sense of calling to ministry.

For Accountability: The Biblical example (see Acts 15) and the example in the early church history is one where local churches have accountability over them. If a church doesn't belong to a denomination or some other organization that can reprimand and/or discipline them, how can that local church say they are a Biblically based church because we find accountability being practiced in the Bible and lived out in the early church? Just as God created individual believers to belong in community with other believers to faithfully live out the faith, God calls community of believers (churches) to be in community with other churches to function faithfully.

**To Protect** the pastor from church-abuse and to protect a church from pastorabuse. Also, to protect churches from abusive pastors. It is a sad reality, but the safeguards are needed.

**For Shared Mission**: More can be done together. For example, many churches cannot fully support a missionary or plant a church. When we partner together to do these things, we can do what is impossible for us to do alone.

**For Legal Protection**: Official positions taken by a denominational on hot button issues can answer why we can't do "x, y, or z", and it can provide legal protection if someone challenges a local congregation in court.

For Mutual Encouragement and Support: Every pastor and church needs to know they are not alone. Fellowship with other pastors or with other churches should be a benefit found in being part of a denomination. Of course, this is only found if one participates.

For Assistance/Resources for ongoing training: This is a benefit a denomination can provide, though too often pastors and local congregations may not take full advantage of what is available. Best practices can be shared as we learn best from one another.

We are better together and I am thankful for a church family who understands the benefits of being a part of the global Christian church.


On June 4th, Pastor Dwayne Richardson (left) was guest speaker. Sue Crossland (above) shared a special story and Bible verse with the congregation.

#### **Marinated Carrots**

By Martha Punches

Prepare two days ahead of event

#### Ingredients:

Veggies:

2 # carrots, sliced thinly or cut using a food processor

1/4 onion, sliced thinly

1/2 green pepper, chopped into small chunks

#### Sauce:

1/2 cup oil

1/2 cup white vinegar

1/2 cup sugar

1 t. Worcestershire Sauce

1/2 t. salt

1/2 t. black or white pepper

1 T. ketchup

1 t. mustard

Boil water in a large pan and add carrots. Boil 5 minutes or until carrots are crunchy, not raw. Drain and pour into storage/serving bowl. Add green pepper and onion. Stir. Set aside.

In a mixing or measuring bowl, combine the sauce ingredients and stir well to blend. Pour over veggies and stir well. Cover and refrigerate for up to three days before serving before serving, stirring often. The longer they marinate, the better they become.
