October 2023: God Camps Out With His People


John 1:14 "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and

truth."

My sons are learning to camp. A few weeks ago, when the weather was nice, my family pulled out our new tent and set it up for the first time in our backyard. The tent was given to us by an aunt and uncle who have aged out of tent camping and graciously passed it on to us.

The boys helped me set it up: separated the poles and stakes, put the poles together, unfolded the tent, and assembled the structure. The tent set up was hours of fun and

we slept in it that night (after watching Toy Story together). We are very grateful for our new tent.



In the New Testament, we read how Jesus is God (John 1:1) and, in John 1:14 (quoted above) he "made his dwelling among us." The word translated "flesh" does not merely mean skin and bones, but humanity. In Jesus, God the Son took on a human nature. By taking on flesh, God "made his dwelling among us", literally it says he did tabernacle among us. You could translate that phrase as "pitched his tent among us". And now that Jesus has ascended into heaven, God the Holy Spirit has made his dwelling within us (Romans 8:9).

The next day, the tent was folded up and put away. The kids were sad to see it go, but it was only meant to be a temporary structure. Eventually, the wilderness tabernacle was packed up as well. But God is still with us. Jesus promised as much (Matthew 28:20). So does Holy Spirit (Ephesians 1:13), who not only dwells in us individually, but as the church (1 Corinthians 12:27; Ephesians 2:22; 1 Corinthians 3:16). God camps out with His people.

41st ANNUAL WOMEN'S RETREAT

Our 41st Annual Women's Retreat, "From Faith to Faith to Faith", is on Saturday, October 28, 2023 from 9 am until 12:30 pm. Doors open at 8:30 am.

This year, our featured guest, Pheba Banerjee, will speak about her journey from India to northwest Ohio, and from Hinduism to faith in Jesus Christ.

The core verse of her message is Romans 5:8: "... God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Pheba shares that, through this verse, "the Lord opened my heart to the truth of the gospel and I came to believe that Christ who is the creator God, took my sins and was crucified, buried, and resurrected on my behalf to make me a child of God."

Pheba came to us through a chance discussion with the Gideon speaker who was with us several months ago. Arlene Cline and Pastor Ian both heard Pheba speak at the Gideon banquet and found her inspiring. We are delighted that God brought us into each others' paths, and that she is willing to share with us.

Pheba is currently the Director of Pastoral Care at The Sanctuary in Bryan Ohio, where she and her husband have been "sharing the love of Christ with the homeless in a practical way" for about two years. Becky Craft and Barb Searing visited her there for a tour and to invite her to speak, which she enthusiastically agreed to do. Becky Riley and Barb were able to attend the 30th anniversary banquet for The Sanctuary and learn more about that ministry, too.

"Pheba's enthusiasm and warmth make her a dynamic speaker for our retreat this year," shared retreat co-planners Becky Craft, Becky Riley, and Barb Searing. "The story of her faith journey as a teenager in India with Hindu culture all around her, including her own family of origin, to a strong faith in Jesus Christ, plus her youthful spark have been a total inspiration to our planning team."

If anyone considering attending this year's retreat has a teenage daughter/granddaughter/youthful church friend, Pheba's message of determination and faith would be most suitable for young people to come and hear.

In addition to thought-provoking teaching, we look forward to marvelous music from pianist Susan Kayser and organist Susan Crossland. Brunch will be served by the men from the Presbyterian Church. While the retreat ends at 12:30 pm, ladies are welcome and encouraged to linger and visit as long as they wish.

Nursery care is available for children from infants through age 4. Be sure to mention this need when you register so we are adequately staffed. You are asked to bring a sack lunch for your child.

Pre-registration is requested by Friday, October 13, 2023.

The cost for this retreat is \$20.00. Checks made out to First Presbyterian Church, with 'women's retreat' in the memo line, can be sent with mail-in registrations. Fees may also be paid at the door the morning of the retreat if registration was made by phone or online.

If attendees wish to make a donation of goods to The Sanctuary in support of Pheba's ministry there, these items are always needed: individual serving non-spicy chips; individually wrapped sweet snacks (cookies, breakfast bars, fruit snacks, etc.); bath towels; dryer sheets; \$5 Walmart or Chief cards.

Pheba has suggested we invite the churches of her board members and other churches that support The Sanctuary to our event, so we are hoping for a robust crowd! We know God will send just the right people to come and hear this wonderful speaker.

They established "I Was Here" at the turn of both centuries, giving us a glimpse into the passing of our time here on earth.
